- The average sports related dental injury is \$5000- \$10,000





Studies have shown that up to 95% of the general public use the type of "boil and bite" mouthguards sold at pharmacies or sporting goods stores. The International Symposium of Dental Materials have stated that this type of mouthguard provides a false sense of protection due to inconsistencies in thickness. In fact, some reports indicate more damage can be done to the teeth when wearing this type of guard compared to no guard at all due to the inaccurate fit.
